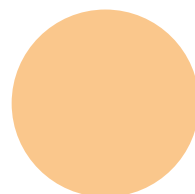
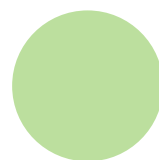

## SWIM TO SURVIVE

I've been working with the YMCA in our aquatics department for over 20 years, starting as a lifeguard and swim instructor when I was in high school. When I moved into an aquatics management role in 2009, one of the initiatives that was started was the Swim to Survive Program. From the first pilot school we brought in at once branch with 22 kids that didn't know how to swim, I realized this was a special program. Over the past 10 years, I've been able to watch the program grow to one that is run across the region with multiple facilities, and in our own YMCA facilities, serving over 15,000 Grade 3 students. Staff enjoy the opportunity to teach these students in an informal setting and see the progress of students getting comfortable in an aquatics environment. The Grade 3 students that come in are enthusiastic to learn these essential skills and trust us to bring them outside their comfort zone. One of the best feelings I've had as a swim instructor is when that student who came in to week one of the program, terrified of the water, is jumping by themselves into the deep end and able to keep their head above the water and swim to the wall by the end of week three.

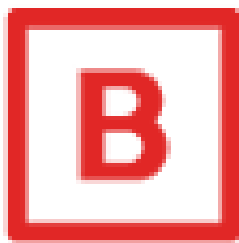
